- 4. Explore public housing or Section 8 voucher options for longer-term stability.

<u>Rental Assistance for Veterans — Clayton County</u>

1. Clayton County Emergency Rental Assistance (ERA) Program

Clayton County offers an Emergency Rental Assistance program for eligible tenants and landlords. This program helps cover rent and utility costs for those facing financial hardship.

2. Georgia Emergency Rental Assistance Programs

The Georgia Department of Community Affairs (DCA) runs the Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) program (formerly Section 8), which provides rental subsidies for low-income individuals, including veterans.

1. HUD-VASH – Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing

A joint HUD/VA program providing Section 8 vouchers plus VA case management and clinical care to veterans who are homeless or at risk due to mental health or substance use challenges. **Contact:** National Call Center for Homeless Veterans at 1-877-424-3838; local Section 8 coordination via DeKalb County Housing Authority

2. Emergency Housing Voucher (EHV)

Funded under the American Rescue Plan. DeKalb County has its own EHV access point. To apply, veterans should contact 2-1-1 (Atlanta) or consult DeKalb Housing Authority for referral

3. DeKalb Integrated Community Care Initiative (ICCI)

A \$13 million county-wide program offering financial aid for rent, utilities, housing instability, and eviction-related legal services.

4. DeKalb County Coordinated Entry (Continuum of Care)

Provides intake, case management, eviction prevention services, security/utility deposit assistance, and permanent supportive housing. **Contact:** Coordinated Entry at 404-687-3500 <u>DeKalb County GA</u>.

5. Eviction Legal Defense Fund

A county-run fund offering free legal representation to residents facing eviction, prioritized to lowincome households.
